

A CDGCBR Annual Award to a young ringer. In memory of Leslie Boumphrey.

The award, in the form of a prize to be awarded annually at the Guild AGM, is to be made to a Guild member under the age of 21. Those eligible will have been nominated by their own tower, with selection being made by the Guild Committee. A winner will not be eligible for nomination in the year following the award. The award is to be made on the basis of evidence of progress and commitment made by the young ringer in all areas of ringing. Nominations for the award are to be made on the Guild's standard pro-forma which should be returned to the General Secretary at least one month before the AGM.

Guidance notes

Examples of comments that could, but not necessarily, include:

General Commitment	<i>Attendance at practice and on Sundays. Attendance at other ringing sessions e.g. weddings, special services, outings. Willingness to catch hold (and also to take turns)</i>
Contribution to 'team' feeling	<i>Cheerful in the tower. Pleasant with other learners. 'Fits in' with the group. Shows interest in all aspects of tower activities. Regarded as a real or potential asset to the tower.</i>
Attitude to learning	<i>Willing to learn new skills. Willing to persevere when things get difficult. Displays a keen interest in 'moving on' and making progress.</i>
Current level of ability	<i>In terms of basic handling skills if necessary, or in terms of method ringing if appropriate.</i>
Achievement	<i>Improvement made in ringing skills during the last twelve months. Notable achievement(s).</i>
Additional relevant information	<i>For example: Shows leadership in peer group. Helps others less experienced. Acts as a good example to other learners. Makes an unusual contribution e.g. shows interest/helps with tower maintenance.</i>
