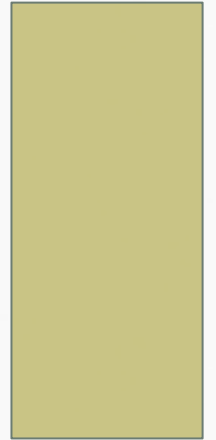

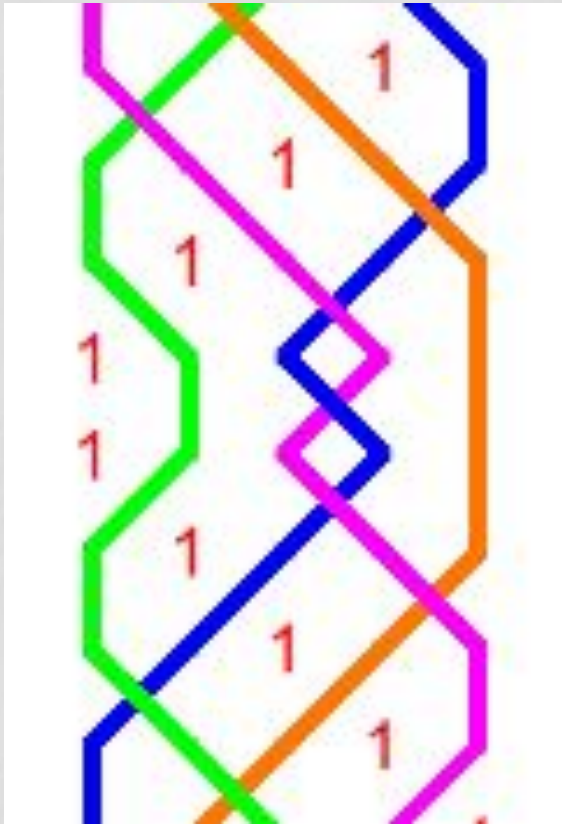


What happens at a bob

Place when bob is called	About to	Work when bob is called	Become which place bell?	Work next time
2 nd blow in lead	Make seconds	Run out	3 rd place bell	Make seconds
3 rd place going up	Dodge 3-4 up	Make the bob 2 blows in 4 th	4 th place bell	Long fifths
4 th place going down	Dodge 3-4 down	Run in	2 nd place bell	Dodge 3-4 down
5 th place	Long fifths	Unaffected	5 th place bell	Dodge 3-4 up



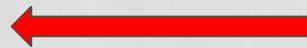
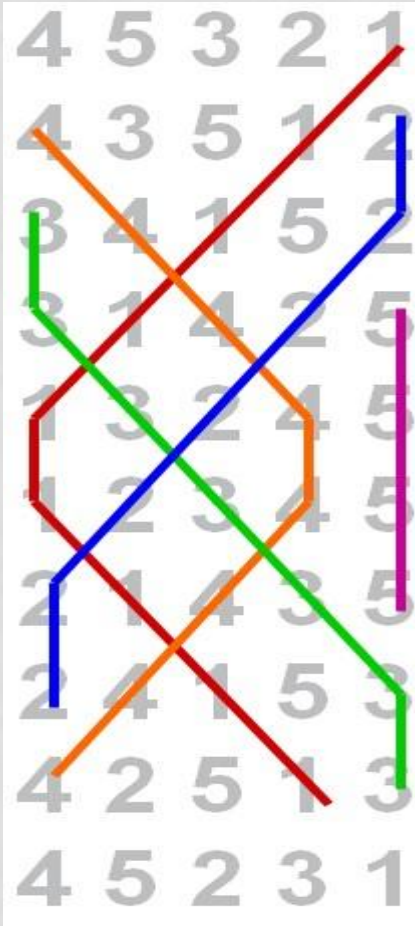
What happens at a bob



Plain Bob Doubles – the bob

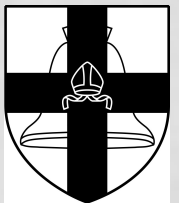


Call yourself unaffected x 3

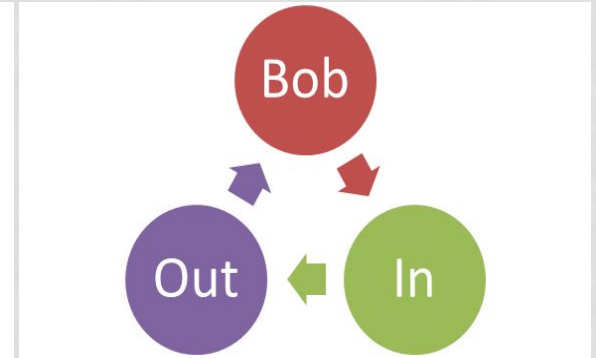
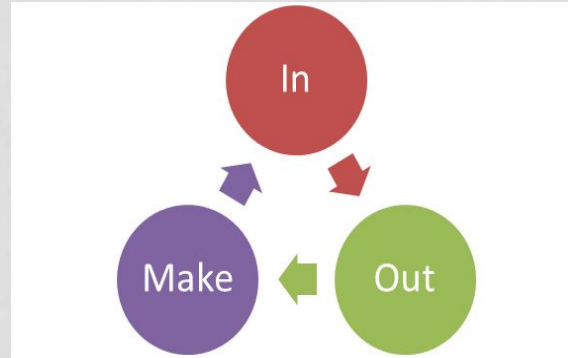
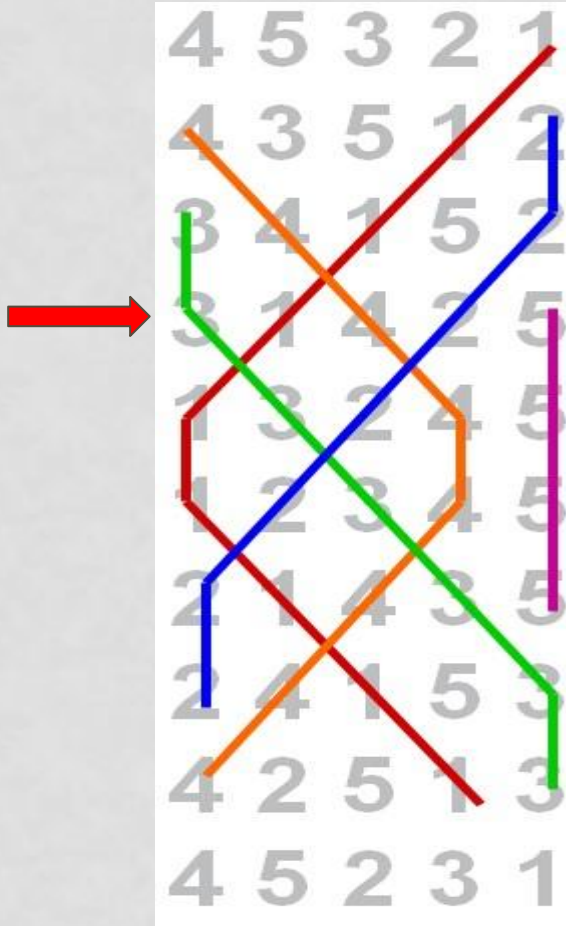


Bob - call at your first blow in 5ths

NB, Also known as "call yourself observation".

Tips that will help

Go Bob Doubles (RR = G)

Bob (RR = B)

That's all (RR = H)

[Stand (RR = T)]

Calling a bob every 4th lead

Noticing who is observation bell if it is not you

Watching the treble

Watch the bells affected



What if you make a mistake

If you miss the call: Wait a whole course and do it again

If you put the call in too early: call yourself observation until it comes round. NB, it might be at handstroke.



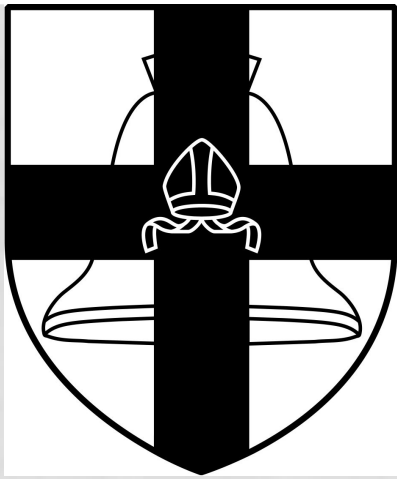
Other touches

2 consecutive leads

60: PBPBPB or BPBPBP

Calling a quarter peal = 1260 changes
